
PROBLEM STATEMENT

- HIV/AIDS and Tuberculosis (TB) are chronic diseases that have reached epidemic proportions in South Africa;
- Increase in sexual abuse, gender based violence, transactional sex, amongst youth;
- Teenage pregnancy is still of grave concern in South African schools.
- Boys and girls as young as 9 and 10 engage in sexual activity.
- Females aged 15-19 have significantly higher HIV prevalence rate than males of the same age.

NDP: Demographics and Health Trends

- The health challenges facing South Africa are well documented. The country faces a quadruple burden of disease:
 - HIV/AIDS and related diseases such as tuberculosis (TB), and sexually transmitted infections (STI)
 - Maternal and child morbidity and mortality
 - Non-communicable diseases (mainly related to lifestyle)
 - Violence, injuries and trauma.

NDP: Demographics and Health Trends

- The estimated HIV prevalence rate in 2012 was about 10.6 percent, with the total number of people living with HIV/AIDS having risen from 4.21 million in 2001 to an estimated 5.4 million in 2011. This number is projected to rise to 7.3 million by 2030.
- The highest levels are among youth: an estimated 16.6 percent of those aged between 15 and 49 are HIV positive.

Core messages up to Adulthood:


- SAFEST choice is NOT to have sex.



Opportunities ahead for strengthening Life Orientation

The DBE in partnership with UNAIDS:

- Developed HIV and AIDS scripted lesson plans to capacitate teachers Grades 6 to 9;
- Developing scripted lesson plans for Grades 10-12.
- Developing Open source material address content gaps in sexuality education through a radical approach.





Opportunities ahead for strengthening Life Orientation

- Improve content knowledge of teachers on sexuality education through capacity building.
- Exposure to innovative methodologies to teach sexuality education.
- DBE in collaboration with HEIs, DSD, DH, stakeholders to strengthen sexuality education programmes.
